TOPIC: Manufacturing constantly changes its nature and, thus, the ways in which it catalyses economic growth, learning and innovation dynamics, both within and across sectors of the economy. The seminar draws on extensive field work in one of the world-leading manufacturing regions – Emilia Romagna, Italy – to disentangle the complex architecture of modern industrial ecosystems and the various types of learning, innovation and diversification processes determining value creation and capture dynamics. We focus on two high-value manufacturing industries: production of automated packaging machineries and medical device system technologies. Industrial ecosystems involve multiple actors, including various types of firms as well as public-private technology intermediaries supported by regional governments. Industrial policy and, critically their alignment to the ongoing transformation in technologies and industrial ecosystems, can play an important role in manufacturing the innovation economy in catching up regions.
